Graduate students within the School of Nursing must obtain a B- or better in core courses to be accepted by the Graduate Programs (School of Nursing policy 214.1) A student who receives a C+ or lower grade in a required course must repeat the course and receive a B- or better to successfully progress and/or complete the degree. No course may be repeated more than once.
